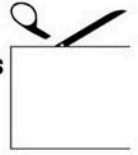


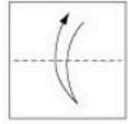
# “Storm’s Coming” Cootie Catcher

**Instructions:**

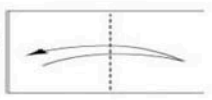
**Cut along the edges of the Cootie Catcher**



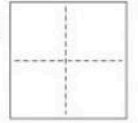
**Fold along the horizontal line**



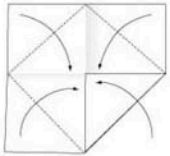
**Fold along the vertical line**



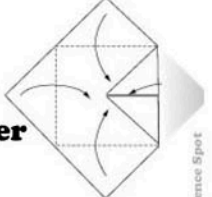
**Open it all up and flip it text down on the desk**



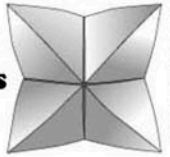
**Fold each corner to the center**














**Flip over and fold each corner to the center**
